Yes indeed! The season of Pentecost, which begins with the final day of the Easter Season, will carry us through the summer and fall months until we come back to Advent time in late fall. And if you know me, you know that I get pretty excited for certain things that happen in our faith life and community throughout the church year, and the celebration and following season of Pentecost is no exception to that wonderful sense of excitement!

For Everything There Is A Season

I had a clock that in my Scotia office that I found in one of the church closets. I knew immediately that I wanted to hang it, because it reminded me of the speedometer in classic hot rods that I explored when I was a kid wandering around my grandfather's back field at the annual Norsemen Rod Run. However, even with a new battery, once a week I have to manually dial it ahead a few minutes, because it runs a bit slow. So every week I would wind it forward. Checking in on that clock had become a rhythm of putting things into perspective.

No matter our age, time is a funny thing. If you're enjoying yourself and look up at the clock, you'd say, "My, how time flies!" If you're finding no joy in what you're doing, you'd say, "How can it be only 2pm?!" Clock time schedules our busy lives and keeps us moving from point A to point B. We now keep our phones, with their always perfect time either near us or in our hands the majority of waking (and sleeping) hours, constantly aware of the time, the things we have done, the things we have yet to do, and the deadlines of life. But we must be reminded occasionally, perhaps by a slow clock on the wall, that time is not so rigid.

Listen to the words of Ecclesiastes 3, "for everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven." The passage then mentions the physical and emotional rhythms of our lives including birth and death, planting and harvesting, finding and losing, listening and speaking, and mourning and dancing. These words of wisdom cause us to remember that we cannot determine the times for most of the important things in life. God has worked these patterns into the fabric of life. Ellen Davis writes that, "when we learn to discern the pattern, then we see that there is a place for every essential aspect of life. Note that there is no right time for oppression or wretched suffering, foolishness or deceit."

I suppose what we have most control over is our posture towards these rhythms of life, and whether we will resist them, or dance to them. I'm about to learn if I can dance to a new rhythm with a baby soon to Arrive! If we can dance to them, we're afforded the gift of being more present to God and the world around us. It's as if we exist out of time and the constraints modern time puts upon us. God's greatest work "in time" was the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. But his life of love, compassion, and hope is timeless. It's easy to get caught looking to the past or squinting toward the future. When I've found myself looking to the past wishing some things hadn't happened, I try to step out of the time-thoughts that are pushing me this way and that, and be present. If I start looking too far into the future, worrying about how different things will be, I do the same. God's work in Christ is timeless, and the things Jesus had faith in like compassion, love, and forgiveness are ever-present. We exist in our 24/7 time, but at the same time, exist in the presence of a God who is always there, a God beyond time, whose ideals are not restricted by schedules and busy thoughts. Maybe all it will take for us to be reminded of that is an old clock that can't quite keep up.
